### FAITH FORMATION NEWS CONFIRMATION LAUNCH

Students in grades 8 and above who would like to receive the sacrament of Confirmation in 2021 through St Matthew parish are invited to our **Confirmation launch on Saturday, October 10**. Parents/guardians should also attend, and other family members are invited, too. Join us for the 4 PM Saturday Mass and then stay in church after Mass for a meeting with Confirmation teacher David Sondag. The Confirmation launch is for the Wednesday evening Grades 8-10 Faith Formation students and for Community of Saints 8th graders who plan to be confirmed with St. Matthew.

### FAITH FORMATION OCTOBER CLASSES

**October 7** is Confirmation class night for Faith Formation and Community of Saints 8<sup>th</sup> graders; class is from 6:50 to 7:50 in the Parish Center. Faith Formation students in grades 1-7 have an at-home family learning evening; see the packet sent home with your child on September 30 for the materials. There is **no class on October 14**. **October 21** is an at-home family learning evening for all grades and families will receive the materials on October 21. **In-person classes for all Faith Formation students grades 1 to 10 resume on October 28**.

### FUND RAISING

Perhaps it was obvious, but parish leadership decided not to have a "usual fall festival" this year. Also, St. Matt's is not going to have a "fix it dinner" either. Still, there are some projects that need funding. The funds raised in 2018 at those events helped to fund the new ramp into Church. It is now so functional and hospitable.

The funds raised in 2019 at those events helped fund the redoing of the social hall bathrooms. That is the first "re-do" since their installation 50 years ago. When that project was launched the need for an ADA compliant bathroom was evident. It would have been prohibitive to change all the plumbing in the current bathrooms to make that space ADA compliant. Instead, parish leaders looked at alternatives: one of them is to remodel 70 sq ft of the kitchen store room and make a single bathroom there. The access will be a door on the opposite side of the hall from the current bathrooms. The funds to be raised in 2020 will help with this remodeling project.

The pastoral council members have agreed to a "calendar raffle" as a fundraiser. More details will be coming: for each \$20 ticket you purchase you will give 30 chances to win...one for each day in November. Deadline for purchase will be October 25.
