“Miserere: Music for Holy Week” presented by Consortium Carissimi
Saturday, April 9, 2022 7:30pm

Founder and Artistic Director of Consortium Carissimi, Garrick Comeaux, became fascinated with the music of the early baroque period and “historically informed performance practices” while living and studying in Rome for many years. The ensemble, Consortium Carissimi, was formed with the purpose of performing these early baroque works. Much of the music performed comes from transcriptions or early publications of printed materials found in European libraries.

The program, “Miserere: Music for Holy Week,” includes sacred music from the Italian early baroque performed by singers one to a part and accompanied by period instruments at a low 415 pitch. This “performance practice” is what makes the ensemble stand apart from many others. Come and hear the stunning music of Lent by Graziani, Carissimi, Marini and Johann Sebastian Bach.
